Parking Plea

Unfortunately it is necessary for us to remind our families once again to consider other road users,

parents, children and residents when parking in Birches Avenue and on Birches Road. It is illegal to park on the yellow 'Keep Clear' zigzag lines outside school and we ask that parents please do not park on the single yellow lines around school during restricted times either. This is for the safety of all, particularly our children. Space is left on the single yellows between our parking signs to enable parking outside of the restricted times and for Blue Badge holders.

The police are aware of the situation and will be patrolling the area periodically. I have also asked for the support of the Highways Agency in helping to keep our school and it's surrounding areas safe for all. Some of you may remember our Parking Pledge scheme. We will be relaunching this with the children in school in coming weeks and hope many of our parents will be keen to get involved.
