Parking Plea

Unfortunately, toward the end of the Autumn term continuing issues with parking in Birches Avenue and on Birches Road were brought to my attention.

We ask again that parents/family members who are dropping children off or collecting from school;

- Please do not obstruct the driveways of residents – we have had reports of residents being unable to leave their properties.
- Please do not park on the yellow lines during restricted times or on yellow zigzags at any time.
- Please do not park on the corner of the junction of Birches Avenue and Birches Road as this significantly reduces drivers' vision.
- Please show due regard and attention to the safety of pedestrians walking along pavements whilst parking. Again, we have received reports of drivers mounting pavements at speed where children are walking. This poses a significant risk.
 - Please **do** supervise your children closely and ensure they cross the road safely. With an increasing number of electric cars on our roads, it is not always possible to hear a car coming.

We will continue to put out our parking signs which provide a reminder to park with consideration. Space is left on the single yellows between our parking signs to enable parking outside of the restricted times and for Blue Badge holders.

We will continue to work with the local PSCOs, wardens and the council to improve safety around the school site and patrols will be carried out periodically.

We appreciate the support of all our families in ensuring the safety of all road users around the school and in fostering positive relationships with our neighbours.

Attendance

I would like to take the opportunity to thank the PFA for their ongoing support. Their hard work and commitment enables us to raise valuable funds and purchase resources that directly benefit the children. Please do remember to notify the school office if your child is absent from school.

Penalty Notices for Absences from School

In accordance with Government legislation, a request for leave can only be authorised if it is deemed to be an "exceptional circumstance". Where a request is not deemed to be an "exceptional circumstance" a child's non-attendance for this period will be marked as an unauthorised absence. This absence will be retained on record throughout their time at school.

Please be aware...if a child has ten days or more unauthorised absence over two half terms in a row, or unauthorised absence alongside an already low attendance score, a penalty notice may be issued to parents/carers of that child. Late marks will be recorded as an unauthorised absence and these will also be taken into account when issuing Penalty Notices

Attendance is monitored regularly by the our attendance officer from Attend Education. Register checks can be carried out without prior consultation with school and may lead to further investigation.

Please consider the impact that any time off school can have on your child in terms of missed learning.
