Maths Task (Addition and Subtraction):

Multiples of 10 -

When we add multiples of 10 to a number, again we need to use place value to help us. We do not need to count on in ones as this could take us a very long time if we are adding, for example, 60.

Look how many tens the number has got. E.g. 57 has got 5 tens. If you are adding 30, we are adding on 3 tens. 5 tens + 3 tens equals 8 tens. The ones number does not change. Therefore, $57 + 30 = 87$. Remember to use this mental method - we do not need to use a written method!!

Support - Use a place value grid to help you if you need to. You could use: straws, lollypop sticks, 10 pence coins, sticks etc. for tens and stones, counters, buttons, bottle tops etc. for ones.

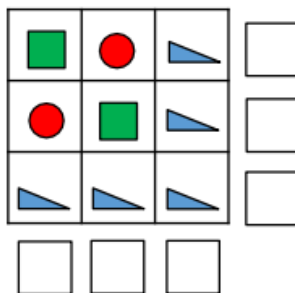
Here are Class 2's crayons.

Take turns to throw one dice. Cross out only one number at a time on the table. The first person to get 4 in a row wins.

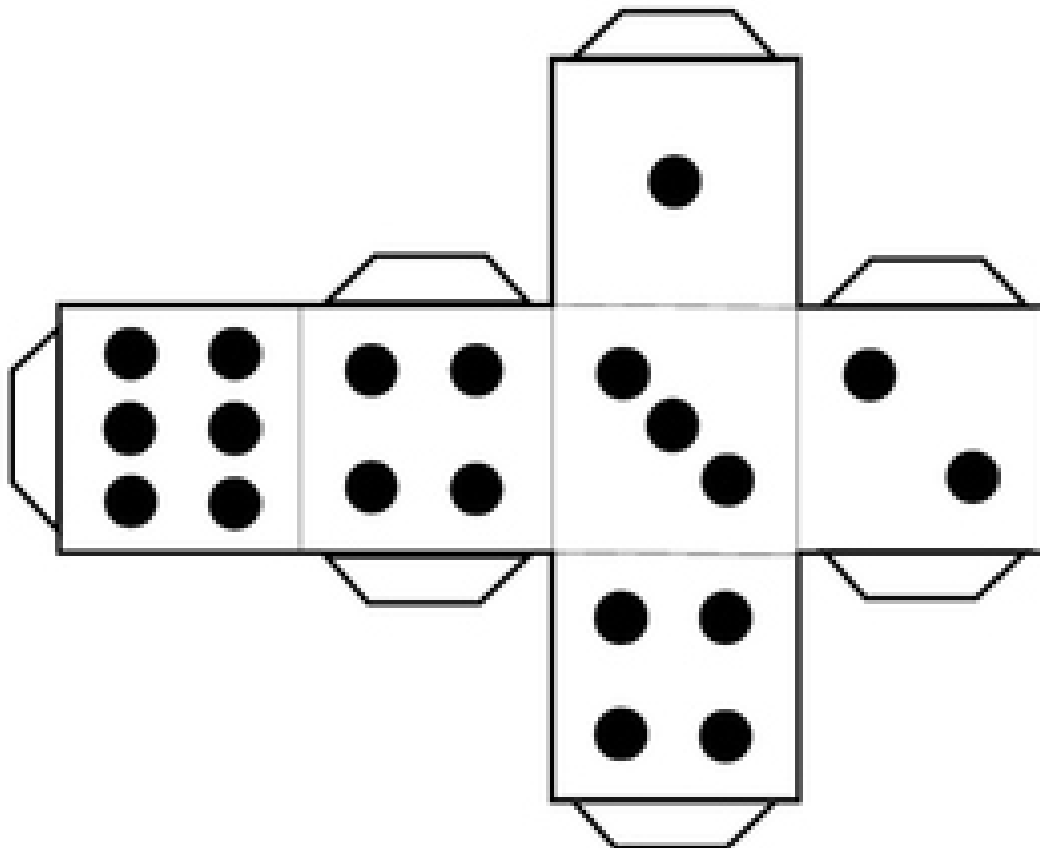
- If you throw a **2** or **4** you must add **40** to it

- If you throw a **6** you can choose the multiple of ten you want to add as long as you can explain it!
