### English

In English this term we will be aiming to persuade! We will use our knowledge of Egypt from our topic work to try to persuade our audience to visit. We will also be developing our poetry skills with a focus poem by Edward Lear. As always we will be reading a range of quality texts to develop our comprehension skills as well as our inference, summarising and predictive skills.

#### Arts / Design Technology

As part of our topic, the children will be designing and making Egyptian mummies and Sphinx sculptures. As part of the design process they will find out about and evaluate existing products before exploring possible techniques and materials. They will select their chosen methods and resources as they design their own product before creating and evaluating their final piece. They will also create Egyptian style paintings.

Music – Ukuleles needed every Wednesday. <u>Computing</u> – Spreadsheets, writing for different audiences. <u>MFL (French)</u> – Months of the year, weather.

#### Humanities

Our focus will continue to be



on Egyptians! The children will be using their geographical skills to locate countries, oceans and continents and significant landmarks and natural features on a range of maps. The topic lends it self

to a range of history skills as the children explore a range of sources of information and find out about life during this ancient time. Maths We will be using concrete materials, pictorial methods and more abstract methods to develop our work on fractions and decimals. We will demonstrate our confidence in multiplication and division through exploring more written methods and by reasoning and solving problems. Please keep practising skills on TTrockstars! These are important skills that help with other work such as fractions and decimals. It also doesn't hurt to practise with the multiplication check fast approaching too!

## Science / STEM

The children will be learning about living things and their habitats. The children will be grouping living things in a variety of ways as well as using classification keys to help group, identify and name living thing in their local environment. We will be exploring changes in environment and how this can pose dangers to living things.
