

<u>Maths Task (Fractions):</u>

Find a quarter

When we are finding a quarter, we are splitting the whole into $4 \frac{\text{equal}}{\text{equal}}$ parts. Remember our key word is equal. A quarter (1/4) is one of four equal parts. The methods we use are the same as when we found a half last week!









Example 1:

Ranjit has 12 sweets. He wants to share them equally with his three friends. How many sweets do they each get?



 $\frac{1}{4}$ of 12 = The whole is 12

We are sharing into 4 equal groups (1/4) – remember cross it out, put it in. Each group should be equal.



So a quarter of 12 is 3 (there are 3 in each group).

Example 2:

 $\frac{1}{4}$ of 44 =


Again, we are not going to draw out 44 ones as this would take us a very long time!!!When we have larger numbers, instead of sharing the ones we can share the tens. Remember to count as you draw the tens and ones — each group should still be equal.




1/4 of 44 = 11







How many different ways can you shade $\frac{1}{4}$ of this rectangle?




Reading Task:

Writing/ SPAG Task:

- Try to think of a different sentence starter or time work to use for each picture. For example: first, next, after that, finally etc.
- Try and plan in a conjunction you could use for each part too bringing in your learning from last week. For example: because, so, if, that, but, when etc.
- Remember to write in chronological order (the order that it happened).
- Use past tense verbs as you are describing what has already happened. Remember to use the rules we learnt last week.
- Remember to use description range of adjectives in expanded noun phrases (e.g. _____, ____ cake).
