School Closure Home Learning Year 2 Daily Tasks

Wednesday 20th May 2020 (Summer Term, Week 5 - Day 3)

Home learning tasks are designed so they can be read from a screen and completed into Home Learning Books. This reduces/ removes the need for printing. In some cases, questions may need to be copied out into home learning books. Of course you may print the tasks if this is easier for your family but please do not feel that you have to.

Maths Task (Money):

Make the same amount

Today we will look at selecting the correct coins to make the same amount. We can use different coins to make the same amount. We can exchange what we have so we can have less coins. For example we can exchange 2 one pound coins for a two pound coin. See below:






Again, we will use all of our previous learning of coins and notes to help us. We will need to count the pounds and pence separately. A reminder that the total will be written using 'and' – for example: £5 and 30 pence or 5 pounds and 30 pence. NOT £5.30. Please encourage children to use pence rather than 'p' at this stage. Where 'p' is used in a question, when reading aloud children should read 'pence'.



Task:

1. Complete the part-whole models. Look at the parts to know how many coins to use.



2. Make each amount in 3 different ways.



3. Make the same total with the fewest amount of coins possible.



4. Using your knowledge f making the same amount. Which purse is the odd one out?



- 5. How many ways can you make 10 pence using only copper coins?
- **6.** What is the fewest number of notes Ron could have? What is the grestest number of notes Ron could have?





Challenge



How many different ways can you make the amount on the purse? You can only use pounds, not pence!



Part 2: If it was 25 pence and you were using pence, would there be more or fewer, or the same number of ways to make your total?
