

Maths Task (Length and Height):

Measure length (cm):

Length is the distance between two ends. Something longer has more length. We use a ruler to measure something in centimetres.

We much remember to start at zero and not the end of the ruler! For example:



If you do not have a ruler to measure you could always use a tape measure or I have put a printable ruler online that you may wish to use (to scale).

<u>Example 2:</u>

Sometimes people make mistakes and do not put the start of the object at '0' on the ruler. However, we can still work out how long an object is.



End of the object – start of the object = length of the object 9cm – 2cm = 7cm The object is 7 cm


<u>Task:</u>

 Choose a variety of objects and practice measuring them using a centimetre ruler. Remember to line the object to the 0 mark on the ruler. Record your results in a table. For example:

Object	Length in cm
Pencil	7cm

Make sure you remember to write cm, or it could be 7 horses!!!!



The height of Flower A is shown below on the cm ruler.




Flower B is 6cm taller than A. How tall is Flower B? ____cm
