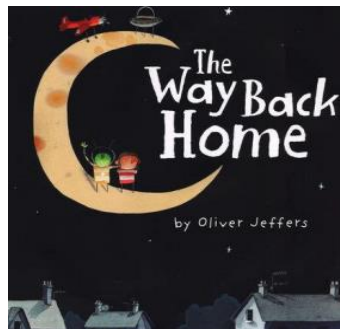

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Polar Bears



Polar bears live in the Arctic. It is cold and icy. They have black eyes and a black nose. They have thick fur, which helps keep them warm. Polar bears eat seals. Polar bears spend most of their lives at sea. Baby polar bears are called cubs. A polar bear's home is called a den.

Questions

1. Where do Polar bears live?
2. Why is fur important to a Polar bear?
3. What is the home of a Polar bear called?
4. Imagine you are a polar bear what might you see when you open your eyes?

Polar bears live in the Arctic. Land in the Arctic is snowy and icy. The temperature falls so low in the winter that the sea freezes. Polar bears have thick fur, which helps keep them nice and warm. Under their skin is around 10cm of blubber (fat). They also have claws that act as a grip on the ice. Polar bears mainly eat seals. They are meat eaters. Polar bears spend most of their lives at sea. They come back to land to have their babies. Baby polar bears are called cubs. A polar bear's home is called a den. When the cubs are born, they stay in their den for five months. Even when they leave the den, they will stay with their mother for up to two years.

6. What other interesting facts do you know about polar bears?
7. Imagine you are a polar bear: what might you see when you open your eyes?
