Dear Parents, during this period of continued school closure, here are some extra learning tasks for children to complete to support their ongoing development of skills and knowledge. Most of these tasks are loosely linked to the topic of 'Summer' which we would have normally covered in the Summer term in our Topic lessons. Please support and encourage your child with their tasks. These tasks can be completed into	Go on a scavenger hunt, either in the house or outside. For example, you could have a hunt whilst in a walk and see how many sticks you can find, how many berries, how many benches etc. Then record your findings as a tally chart or turn your results into a bar chart.	Make your own comic book strip. This could be on a fictional hero that you have made up or could be based on an existing comic book. For example, you might want to use ideas from the stories Captain Underpants.	Make your summertime snack into a history lesson by trying a new dish from around the world! You may be surprised to find that your favourite treat is actually an Indian dessert, or you could find a new favourite by trying a Brazilian flavour combination. Tie in your maths skills by measuring ingredients in the kitchen. *Always ask an adult for help when preparing food and using kitchen equipment.
