Adding 'ed' to words to make new words.

(This was the spelling rule for the spellings I set you two weeks ago)

You can add **– ed** to the end of many **action** words (verbs) to make new words.

Words ending in **-ed** tell us that the action happened **in the past**.

The **-ed** at the end of a word can make different sounds.


For example the word look +ed = looked (t) – being the sound




Make equal groups

Match the pictures to the labels.






equal groups
