2 Times-table -


Task:

Writing/ SPAG Task:

Non-Chronological Reports -

Today we are going to start writing our non-chronological report. We need to remember all of our brilliant skills we have built up over the last week.

Structure:

- Uses a title
- Write an introduction paragraph giving information about who, what and where.
- Put your information into sections/ paragraphs
- Some information may be in fact boxes or bullet-point lists
- Give each section a subheading
- Use facts that you have researched
- Includes pictures with captions

<u>Language:</u>

- Uses formal/factual language, e.g. habitat, astronaut, monarch etc.
- Present tense verbs
- Remember your full stops, apostrophes and capital letters
- Use conjunctions such as that, because, when and if to create longer sentences

Task: Write the introduction to your non-chronological report. This may only be a small section today and we can build on it tomorrow.

Try and use alliteration in your title. For example: extraordinary elephants
