Maths Task (Multiplication and Division):

Make equal groups (sharing) -

Now we have become more confident with our multiplication skills, we can work on division. Remember we need to cross it out, put it in. We need to make sure that our groups are equal. This means the <u>same.</u>


You could use real life objects to sort into groups to help you.

Share 12 cubes between 3 people.





How many cubes does each person get?




Cross it out - put it in.

We can write this as a division number sentence.







2. Match the number sentences to the representation.

5. 30 flowers are shared equally between 5 vases.




Problem Solving:


Challenge:
