<u>Making Cookies</u>

He can hardly wait for the cookies to be ready. In 30 minutes, the cookies are finished baking. The cookies are hot and yummy.

- 4. What does he do with the bowl?
- 5. Why do you think his mum places the baking sheet into the oven?


