## <u>Reading task – presenting information</u>

Over the last two days you have retrieved and recorded the information from the rainbow text. Today you are going to present the information that you found!

It is up to you how you would like to present this information. You could –

- Be a television presenter and show your family how rainbows are made. Use pictures as prompts or check out videos of experiments online.
- Rewrite the text adding more presentational features such as bullet points, fact boxes, headings, subheadings.
- Find out more about rainbows and orally present the information to your family. Consider how you can use actions, volume and tone to keep your listener interested. Be confident!
- Try to simplify the explanation to make it suitable for a younger audience. You could make a mini-book for their class library.

#### <u>Maths task</u>

Position and direction – moving on a grid

Now that we can read and draw coordinates we are going to see how we follow directions to move shapes and points on a coordinate grid. We call this movement a 'translation'.

Work with a grown up for this first task.

- Print out the grid if you can and use a small object OR use a piece of blue tac on your screen if you do not have a printer.
- Place your object/blue tac at (1,1).
- Move it 1 up
- Move it 3 right
- Move it 4 up
- Move it 4 left

When you are confident moving your object, ask your grown up to give you another set of instructions.



Translate A 6 right and 3 down. Record the coordinates before  $(\_,\_)$ and after  $(\_,\_)$ Translate B and C 4 left and 3 up. Record the coordinates before  $(\_,\_)$ and after  $(\_,\_)$ 



Translate the rectangle 2 left and 3 up. Write down the coordinates of each vertex of the rectangle before and after the translation.
