English. In English this term we will be reading a range of texts to develop pleasure in reading. We will retell and role play a range of familiar stories. We will apply our phonic skills as we read familiar words, new words and sentences.

Arts. / Design Technology

As part of this topic the children will be drawing, painting and designing familiar buildings in the local area. They will select their chosen materials as they design their own models.

Religious Education - Caring: Listen to examples of care and concern shown by believers and religious communities. Explore the reasons for these actions.

<u>Computing -</u> Learn about ways in which we can stay safe whilst using the internet and the reasons for staying safe. Purple Mash

<u>Humanities</u>

Our topic will give opportunities for children to: learn about their immediate environment, explore their school environment using first hand observational skills, create and use maps of the local area, experiment with modelling and drawing, to represent the world around them, take part in fieldwork around school and learn about maps symbols.

Maths. Our focus for the first part of the term will be developing skills of number recognition and counting. We will count to 20 forwards and backwards, beginning with 0 or 1, or from any given number. We will count, read and write numbers to 20

The children will identify and represent numbers using objects and pictorial representations including the number line. We will be finding the number that is one more/one less than a given number and we will work on simple addition and subtraction activities.

Science / STEM

The children will be learning about different materials. They will distinguish between an object and the material which it is made from. They will also be identifying and naming a variety of everyday materials including wood, plastic, glass, metal and rocks. We will describe, compare and group objects together using their properties.

PE / Games - Playground games/ Fundamental movement skills
PSHE - Me and My School.
