

We looked at a variety of photos and placed the pictures all starting with the same initial sound 'a' into the bowl whilst singing the silly soup song. The children had to then use their memory to recall all the photos we placed in the bowl, emphasizing the initial sound 'a'.

### Reading for Pleasure-Recall a story

Nursery have been listening to further stories to help us understand our feelings in PSHE/PSED.

We have also enjoyed listening to the story 'Three Billy Goats Gruff' as chosen by the class. The children used the story to recreate bridges, trolls, goats and 'green, green, grass' in their play. We observed the children re-telling the story using lots of different key phrase such as "trip trapping over my bridge" and mathematical language to describe the size of the Billy Goats Gruff.
