

Communication

During the Autumn Term all parents received either an email or telephone call from their child's class teacher regarding how their child settled back into school. I feel it is important as we have not held our normal 'Meet the Teacher' and 'Individual Private Parent Interviews' that parents receive some correspondence at the end of the term. All class teachers will be sending out a 'Celebration Newsletter' for you to read. The aim of the newsletter is to keep you informed of the wonderful activities and learning opportunities that take place within the year group and truly should be celebrated!

Government Restrictions

As the national lockdown ends this week we will all be feeling more anxious and worried about what lies ahead within our Tier 3 Banding. We will each have our own thoughts on the decisions being made in government but we have no control over these. We do however, have the power to influence our own little community. Therefore, within school we are continually meticulously implementing our guidance.

Following Covid safety guidance, we continue to ensure that classrooms are well ventilated which does mean that windows and doors are open. Staff are finding that they are needing to layer their clothing; thermal vests and more have been purchased! Please think about this if your child is feeling the cold - temperatures in classrooms will be lower than usual for this time of year so it is more than likely that children will need those 'extra layers' which can always be removed. Do please remember to label any extra garments which

children may wear!

Finally, I would personally like to thank the children in each class for their remarkable behaviour and attitude during the Autumn Term. Sitting forward facing, only socialising within their class, having limited resources (due to Covid restrictions) can be hard going, however, they come to school every day smiling and adapted to all new measures imposed magnificently...they really are an absolute joy and credit to us.

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Teachers' Worklife Balance	
As you are aware due to the many restrictions imposed within schools, First/Primary teachers are having even less non-contact time from their classes (assemblies/playtimes	
etc) than ever.	
We are in very challenging times, workload has significantly increased not only preparing	
lessons but, cleaning apparatus, tables, chairs etc. between sessions and not to mention the	
home-leaning that must be provided for any child who is self-isolating. As always our fabulous teachers NEVER 'grumble' or 'complain' and continue happily (often working from	
8am-6.30pm at school and then continuing into the evening) knowing they are doing the	
very best they possibly can for the children-ensuring they are both safe and happy.	
As communication is limited and face-to-face conversations are not taking place please can	
you ensure that only emergency emails are sent to class teachers. I would ask you to be	
very mindful of the constant pressures that teachers are under. Currently some teachers are	
having an overwhelming amount of emails from parents and although I have already ex-	
pressed in previous Newsletters that teachers can respond in a timely manner which is convenient for them they feel a duty to respond to all emails. Please before emailing teaching	
staff could your answers be found via our Newsletter, Website or calling the office.	
It is my duty to protect the teacherswhere would we be without them?!


