#### Literacy

In Literacy this term the children have worked hard applying their new phonics skills to a variety of early reading and writing activities. In the first half term we wrote CVC words and later progressed to writing captions. We have also had a focus on teaching the children to form their letters correctly and control the letter size of their writing. We are also really pleased with how the children have progressed with learning their word lists, along with exploring lots of new books.

#### Expressive Arts and Design

As part of our topics, the children have developed their creative skills as they have planned, created, and adapted their work with adult support. They have explored the learning environment and have selected their own resources. They have also enjoyed exploring our role play areas, using their wonderful imaginations, as they have worked together to take on different roles in their play.

## Personal, Social and Emotional Development

The children have formed lovely friendships as they have worked together and played collaboratively. An important focus has been on taking turns and managing feelings and behaviour, as they follow class/school expectations.



# Maths

The children have really enjoyed our daily maths lessons. They have been developing their early mathematical skills, as we have explored a variety of maths resources to help them to read, write, order, and count accurately.

We have created patterns and sequences and have explored a variety of simple 2D shapes.

# Understanding the World

The children have really enjoyed exploring the world around them as we focussed on the season of autumn in the first half term. We explored nature and looked closely at patterns and change. During our topic, this half term we have enjoyed learning about different celebrations.

## Physical Development

During our 'Funky Finger' sessions we have supported the children to develop the dexterity in their fingers, to help them hold a pencil correctly with a secure pencil grip. When the weather has been kind to us, we have enjoyed playground games and Dance in PE.
