
English In English this term we will be reading a range of quality texts to develop our comprehension skills. Starting the term with a focus on Discussion texts, we will then move onto a unit on Myths and Legends. This links well with our topic, as we will be reading The Egyptian Cinderella. The children will making comparisons with the traditional version of this fairy tale. They will also read the Egyptian myth of Isis and Osiris. Towards the end of the half term, again linking to our topic, we will be learning about biographies and writing about the life events of significant Egyptians.

Arts / Design Technology As part of our topic, the children will be designing and making Egyptian mummies and Sphinx sculptures. They will also explore Egyptian style paintings and hieroglyphics. Toward the end of the term, we look forward to our Art block on Art and Design skills. The children will practise and develop their sketching and still life drawing skills as well as looking at the style and influence of artists Barbara Hepworth and Cezanne. In DT, during a block on Structures : Pavilions, the children will work through the design process, exploring existing products, designing, building and then evaluating their projects.

Music - STOP! Music learning through games, singing and composing focused around a rap/song about bullying. <u>Computing</u> - Coding and spreadsheets MFL (French) – Counting, using 'c'est', answering questions

Humanities

Through our Topic, the children will



oceans and continents as well as significant landmarks and natural features on a range of maps. The topic lends itself to a range of history skills as the children explore a range of sources of information and find out about life during this ancient time, why it is significant as well as learning about how we know about this ancient time period.



Maths We begin the term learning about Length and Perimeter, including units of measure and how to measure the perimeter of different shapes. Our focus will then move onto consolidating and developing skills of multiplication and division using concrete materials, pictorial methods and working towards abstract methods. We will spend some time learning about Area and how to measure the area of shapes. We will then return to Multiplication and Division and develop our understanding of written methods. Remember to keep practising your skills on TTrockstars too!

Science / STEM

The children will continue to learn about electricity before moving onto sound. The children will be identifying how sounds are made, associating them with vibrations. Through investigation and experimentation the children will find patterns between pitch and volume and their link to vibrations.

<u>Religious Education –</u> Landmarks in life/how commitment to Lent affects the lives of believers.

PE / Games – Games kit needed on Tuesdays and PE kit needed on Fridays - Gymnastics focus.
