Literacy

Read winter-themed books to the children and encourage them to join in with repeated refrains.

Take a trip to your new local Codsall Library.

Draw a picture of your favourite scene form one of the books. What did you like about it? How did it make you feel?

Physical Development

Create your own Winter Tale Playdough Recipe (see attached)

You could also add some shiny silver beads, pipe cleaners and sequins to use with the playdough. Create a 'winter world' using cotton wool, white sheetsperhaps some of your toys like a throne for a snow queen or king to sit on! Add crowns, wands, polar animal soft toys and snowmobiles (bikes and

ractors) for lots of magical, winter role play fun and storytelling!



Mathematics

Go on a walk and collect a selection of natural materials, such as conkers, pine cones and leaves. Create repeating patterns using the natural materials. What do you notice about your patterns?



Communication & Language

Go outside on a cold day and talk about what they can see, hear, smell and touch. Think about and describe signs of winter, such as frosty surfaces or being able to see your breath.

Understanding the World

Make Hedgehog Bread with your child. Model to the children how to use their hands to knead and pinch the dough. Encourage them to shape their dough using kneading and

pinching.



Expressive Arts and Design

Talk about how birds can sometimes find it difficult to find food in the winter. Think of ways that the children can help the birds. Make a simple <u>bird feeder</u> using recyclable materials and hang them in your outside area. Observe birds as they come to feed and talk about why we need to feed wildlife in the winter.
