Year 2 Parent Information:

Spellings - Spellings will continue to be uploaded to the school website. Their spelling book <u>must</u> be returned to school each Friday for them to complete their test in. Please help your child to practise their spellings regularly at home and look over any errors the children have made during the previous week.

Home Learning – A full list of common exception words alongside other useful home learning resources can be accessed on the website under the 'Year 2 Home Learning' tab. Optional Maths home learning is being sent home weekly. Please return to school for marking. Knowledge organisers are available on the school website to support children at home. Y2 writing mats have been uploaded to the school website to support any writing at home. Please feel free to send in any writing for feedback. Handwriting books are sent home fortnightly – please complete 3 lines of each join/ letter and a line of each word.

Reading Books - Please continue to ensure that children are reading each night and change their book <u>at least once per week</u>. As always, once your child has completed their book, please comment and sign their reading communication diary so we know it is ready to be changed. VIPERS can be found in the back of your child's reading diary to help with comprehension skills.

Numbots/ TTRockstars - Please continue to encourage your child to access Numbots/ TTRockstars throughout the week to consolidate their Maths learning. Access will continue to be monitored. Thank you for your support with this. Children will be tested on their times tables every Friday.

PE/ Games - Games with Coach Chris will continue on a Friday and PE will take place on a Wednesday. As a reminder, PE kits should be sent into school on a Monday and come home on a Friday. Please ensure all jewellery (including earrings and watches) and removed.

English

This term, we will continue to read a range of quality, age-appropriate texts to develop pleasure in reading and improve our comprehension skills. We will be learning about the features of fantasy stories to write our own fantasy story about a dragon. We will also be developing our understanding of recounts by writing an eyewitness account linked to our History learning. We will focus on using a range of conjunctions to extend our sentences, as well as using a range of sentence types within our writing.

Arts. We will develop our Art and Design Skills by replicating the recognisable crockery of Clarice Cliff, exploring tone through shading, developing weaving skills, the manipulation of clay and experimenting with brush strokes. Design Technology We will explore textiles as an introduction to sewing. We will make our own template, accurately cut our fabric and sew a basic running stitch when making a pouch.

<u>Music</u> As musicians, we will use instruments to represent animals. We will copy rhythms, learn a traditional African call and response song and recognise simple notation, progressing to creating animal-based call and response rhythms.

<u>Religious Education</u> We will identify the importance for some people of belonging to a religion and recognise the difference this makes to their lives <u>**Computing**</u> After consolidation our learning on Coding, we will extend our computer skills by using and creating spreadsheets. Then we will learn to use 2Paint to create pictures using technology.

<u>Geography</u>

We will begin by studying the UK, focusing on the 4 countries of the UK and their capital cities. We will look at where London is and identify its landmarks.

History

We will be travelling back to the 17th century to discover what happened during the Great Fire of London. By using a range of artefacts, we are going to be looking at the causes of the fire, how the fire spread, the impact the fire had and how life changed after this historical event. Children will learn how

to compare old London to present London, use their enquiry skills to identify the similarities and differences and learn to sequence the main events on a timeline using historical vocabulary and dates to order them. <u>Maths</u>. We will build on our Year 1 knowledge of recognising 2D shapes to begin describing properties of 2D and 3D shapes using the key words: vertices, polygon, quadrilateral, symmetry, faces, sides and edges. We will then use this to help us compare and sort common 2D and 3D shapes. We will then be developing our understanding of fractions by recognising, finding and naming fractions (1/2, 1/4, 2/4, 3/4). The children will understand the importance of equal parts with fractions and use this to help them find the fraction of a number. We will identify the relationship between different fractions such as halves and quarters to develop a greater understanding of fractions.

<u>Science / STEM</u>

We will be continuing with our Science topic of: Animals including Humans. We will learn about how animals and humans change as they grow and we will find out about the basic needs of animals and humans, for survival. By 'working scientifically' children will explore the effects of exercise on their bodies and understand its importance. We will learn about different food types and understand why it is important to be hygienic.

PE / Games. We will continue to use simple movement patterns in Dance showing control, co-ordination and varying level, direction and speed. We will continue to develop fundamental movement skills with Coach Chris in Games. **PSHE** We will be developing an understanding of safety: roads and medicines and an introduction to online safety; distinguishing secrets from surprises; naming body parts and looking at the concept of privacy.
