## Y2 Jackfield Tile Museum Visit

Dear Parents,

As part of our Art Curriculum in Year 2, children are given opportunities to explore the way that clay can be shaped and joined as well as learning a range of essential skills for working with this medium. To support our learning and enhance our learning across the curriculum, we have arranged a visit to Jackfield Tile Museum on **Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> November 2022**. This will also be linked to our History lessons next half term where we will be learning about the Great Fire of London.

The visit will include a workshop led by the museum education staff who will create a clay tile with the children as well as a tour of the museum.

Children will be travelling by coach, leaving school at approximately 9.00am. The children will eat their lunch at the museum and arrive back to school in time for the end of the day. As your child is entitled to a free school lunch, we are able to offer a simple packed lunch. However, please feel free to send your child with their own 'treat' packed lunch with 2 drinks (no glass bottles or fizzy drinks please) in a named carrier bag. This can then be disposed of once we have eaten. Should you require a packed lunch this should be ordered at the office by 9.00am on Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> November 2022.

The children should wear full school uniform but may wear sensible walking shoes, such as trainers. The cost of the trip will be £22.75 which covers the cost of the coach, a tour by museum staff and an interactive workshop creating their own clay tile. Payment for the visit is to be made through ParentPay. When you make the payment, you are giving permission for your child to attend the visit. Should you wish to pay by ParentPoint please see the school office who will provide you with a barcode.

We look forward to an enjoyable day and sharing our exciting learning with you.
