Booking for April will **start on March 1st,** and you have **until the 10th of March** to book your free activities, **from the 11th** you can call up to book additional activities but there may be a charge by the Provider as Staffordshire County Council will fund two free places. Expression of Interest activities will be confirmed as soon as possible after the 10th, in order for you to look at other activities.

Bookings via the SEND booking line ...

Expression of Interest. Some of our providers have sessions which are really popular and generate waiting lists, so from March some of the activities you call to book will have an Expression of Interest list. The providers will then get the list and contact you to confirm the booking, we have asked them to contact you around the 10th of the month, in order that you can look at booking other activities if you were not successful, this means they can keep the list and follow up with you to:

- To confirm your place
- To check any medical or risk assessment needs
- To talk to you about their other activities
- To check if your child needs a 1:1 place, 2:1 place or any additional needs (many of the providers offer 1:1 support but need to know this before your child attends, the more we know the better we can support, and needing a 1:1 or 2:1 space is not going to stop us trying to ensure your child and you have a short break)
- To check nearer the date that you still are available to attend
- Offer out any cancelled places to the others on the waiting list
- To ensure there is a fair spread of accessing their sessions
- To hopefully avoid the non-attended booked places

We will trial this for March and April and see how it goes. So, for any activities that the SEND booking team say are **Expression of Interest**, you will then get a confirmation call from the **Provider to confirm your place**.

As we are about to start year 2 of the contract, you may notice that there are a few less activities than normal, that is because of the transition between the planning and delivery of the end of year 1 contract and the start of year 2. We also will no longer be having Sherrats Wood delivering activities, they have sadly chosen to stop the Aiming High contract delivery, putting all their efforts into the other amazing work they do – we would like to thank them for all their wonderful activities over the years and wish them well in their new adventures. New group about to start in the Moorlands!

Stoke City presently run **ABILITY COUNTS** sessions at Gnosall and Rugeley and they are about to start a new group at Audley Community Centre, Nantwich Road, Audley, SOT, ST7 8DH from Friday $3^{\rm rd}$ March at 16:30-18:30. They want to focus on the children and young people who struggle to follow structure, are non-verbal or who would be classed as having a severe learning, social or physical disability which may affect their focus or ability to take part in general sporting activity. The key can be purchased by anyone with a permanent disability, you will need to provide evidence to support this. Radar keys can be purchased at Tourist Information Centre's and various locations across the county – please check with your district council.

Family Fund

Family Fund provides families raising a disabled, or seriously ill child on low incomes, with wide ranging grants for essential items. Whether you need a kitchen appliance, like a fridge, cooker or washing machine, clothing or bedding, sensory or play equipment or technology for your child or a much-needed family break, they are there to help.

You can apply for any items that will help meet your child's additional support needs.
