Summer 1 Birches Value focus: Enthusiasm

Being enthusiastic helps your mental and physical health. As you work hard to achieve your goals, you become more positive, which boosts your self-confidence. 
To be enthusiastic we need to:

Tolerance of Different Cultures and Religions
