How do we learn in Reception?

The Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum – EYFS

Our children at Birches First School will be learning skills, acquiring knowledge and demonstrating their understanding through 7 areas of learning and development.

Characteristics of Effective Learning

Characteristics of Effective learning underpin everything we do in EYFS. Much of our learning in EYFS is through play. Children have opportunities to investigate and explore. Learning in EYFS is hands on, children need to experience new things in order to learn. And of course it all makes learning fun! Through play, children have the opportunity to solve problems, make links and develop resilience, all skills that they need to be effective learners as they go through their school life.





Birches First School-Life in Reception

- In Reception your child will be fully integrated into Birches First School.
- They will have the opportunity to represent their class on the school council.
- They will join in with assemblies tailored to their age and understanding.
- They will eat lunch in the school hall and enjoy time on the large playground at lunchtime.
- They will have an extra games session with an external sports provider as part of their physical development for multi-skills.
- They will have a small amount of homework each week.
- They will have access to our online maths subscriptions 'Ten Town' and Numbots'.
- They will have the opportunity to share achievements through Tapestry, Show and Tell, The Chatterbox.
- They will receive awards in assembly- Merits and Gold Star.



A Typical Day in Reception

- 8.30- Children will be greeted on the playground where they will line up ready to come into school.
- Dough disco.
- Time for Phonics.
- Next we will learn some new words linked to a story- Get up stand up vocabulary!
- Story time.
- Choosing time- it's time to play!
- Maths- children will learn about Number, Shape, Space and Measure.
- 11.50- Lunchtime!
- Topic input
- Choosing time- it's time to play!
- Story time.
- **3.05pm-** Home time- children will be dismissed onto the playground to you.



Health

- Our first priority above all else is to keep your child safe.
- Staff need to be aware of your child's medical background, in particular any allergies (e.g. bee stings, dairy food), any dietary restrictions (e.g. vegetarian or Halal) and any medical conditions that are important for us to know (e.g. asthma or eczema).
- We can only administer medicines that need to be taken 4 or more times a day.
- We use 'Marvellous Me' to communicate accidents with you. We will phone if there is a more serious concern.
- Please make sure that contact details are always up to date.



Keeping Your Child Safe

- Please tell us who is collecting your child if it is someone different- they will need to know the 'password' that you have given to us if they have not collected before.
- Be patient with us at dismissal, especially in the early days! We are keeping your children safe.

In the early days, we will reward good behaviour with stickers, verbal praise, sending home a wow moment on Tapestry or Marvellous Me.

Once children are settled, we will introduce our 'Good to be Green' behaviour system that is used throughout the whole school. We will communicate this to you when it is introduced and explain it in detail.

Getting to School

We promote a Healthy Ethos in School and we also want to encourage children to protect the planet.

If possible, please walk to school. Not only does this promote healthy habits but it also helps with the parking situation outside of school.

Bikes and scooters are welcome! We have a safe place for bikes and scooters to be stored outside of the playground gates.

If you do need to drive to school, please be mindful of safety with driving and parking around school. We have very supportive neighbours but they do get frustrated with inconsiderate parking- please help to keep our neighbours happy and most importantly, keep our children safe!

Please do not turn in the school driveway- there is a safer turning circle further up Birches Avenue.



School Uniform

- Grey trousers or skirt
- White Birches embroidered polo shirt
- Red Birches embroidered sweatshirt/cardigan
- White or grey socks/ red or grey tights



- Summer dresses (Summer term only) red and white checked. No jumpsuits or culottes.
- Sensible black shoes not trainers or trainer style
- Book bag embroidered (donated by PFA).
- Long hair must be tied back. Bobbles and slides must be red or white.
- Earrings- small studs only. Children must have earrings taken out for PE.
- Children will need a pair of wellies that they can leave in school at all times.

School Uniform- PE and Games

P.E sessions-

Food and Drink

Lunch:

- School lunches are free to all Reception, Year 1, Year 2 children.
- Menu available on school website and via Marvellous Me.
- Menu options include vegetarian option and jacket potato.
- School sandwiches are available but must be booked in advance.
- You have the option to provide a packed lunch.
- Children will learn to become independent in getting their lunch and carrying it to their table but there are lots of adults to support in the first few weeks.
- Snacks- children are provided with fruit each day. You can provide fruit for your child's snack if you wish.
- Please send children to school with a named water bottle.
- Children will be offered milk each morning.





Birches Club- Wraparound Care

At Birches First School we offer Wraparound Care from 7.30am- 5.30pm. This is available for all children including Nursery children.

Before School Club-

- 7.30am- 8.30am (children can be dropped off anytime within this time).
- We do not provide breakfast but parents can provide breakfast for children to eat at club. (we can provide milk for cereal).
- Before School Club costs £4.50 per day.

After School Club-

- 3.00pm- 5.30pm (children can be collected at anytime during this time).
- £4.50 per hour regular/ pre-booked. £5.50 per hour for late booking.
- Children can bring after school snack to eat in club. If children are staying for full club they can bring extra snack.
- -Full wraparound care (both before and after school regular/ pre-booked) £16.50 per day.



Phonics



- Phonics is how we teach children to read and write in the early days.
- Phonics is taught every day.
- We use the 'Little Wandle Scheme'.





- We will send links to our phonics learning each week so that you know what your child is learning and can help to support them at home.
- Children will rapidly learn new sounds and letters. We advise that you purchase some Little Wandle phonics cards to practice the sounds at home- you can purchase these from amazon.
- Children will learn their first set of sounds and be able to blend sounds to read some simple words before they are ready to bring home a reading book. This is usually after about the first 6 weeks in Reception, for some it might take a little longer.

- We will try to communicate with you as much as we can, especially during the early days.
- 'Welcome to Reception' meeting in September where we will go through our homework, online subscriptions (Ten Town, Numberbots), Phonics, Boom Reader in more detail. You will be given subscription log ins during this meeting and we will answer any questions you may have.



How will we communicate with you?

- Monthly newsletter- informs you what has been happening in school and what is coming up. Sent out via Marvellous Me/Text/Website.
- Letters sent out via Marvellous Me/Text/Website.
- Surveys- Google Forms.
- Marvellous Me- information, first aid, homework, curriculum.
- Tapestry- for sharing learning, Wow moments.
- Face to face- speak to myself or Mr Hallmark on the door at drop off. If we are not on the door, please ask another member of staff and they will inform us. Miss Varricchione is always on the gate to help.
- Parent's Evenings 3 times a year
- Reports twice a year.
