Our Ofsted Report has now been published via Ofsted's website for the public to access, initially, only parents of children at Birches see the report. We are



We are very excited to hold our Easter Parade in the school Hall from 2.15pm



#### Fundamental British Value Spring 2 Mutual Respect

The key message that we continue to learn about this value this half term is that we all need to show mutual respect to others because it means you care about other people's feelings. Mutual Respect means that we treat other people the way we want to be treated

which can be difficult especially when others have not shown mutual respect. We will be looking at the idea that people can see things from different points of view, and we need to learn to respect everyone's different point of view. The fundamental aspect of this value is teaching the children to understand why and how to show respect to everyone no matter what our differences may be. We celebrate this diversity daily in our curriculum and children will be reminded of examples such as our celebration of different religious festivals throughout the year, the participation of all our children, from a wide range of backgrounds, includes people with special needs or a disability and people who come from a range of different cultural backgrounds.

#### Birches Value- Curiosity

This half term we are encouraging children to be curious! We will be modelling an open, inquisitive attitude to new and familiar activities, ideas, people, and cultures. Curiosity is contagious....inspiring children to try a new sport, start a new hobby, or learn more about an unfamiliar subject. We will integrate this as part of our Fundamental British Values teaching by discussing and learning about people with different backgrounds and viewpoints.

We will be ensuring we ask open-ended questions that encourage children to seek out their own answers—questions that cannot be answered with a yes or a no or a shrug of the shoulders! Open-ended questions can begin with phrases like:

- What would happen if ...
- What would it be like to ...
- Why did ...
- How do we know that ...
- What did you think when ...

## Parking



Firstly, **thank you** to all the parents/relatives who do park considerably and legally. Please continue to do so! However, unfortunately, I am receiving continuous emails and

telephone calls from residents who complain regarding the parking of some

of our school community. Towards the end of the last half term, parking has been increasingly bad, with outside agencies involved due to the illegal events occurring.



At Birches, we deliver lessons and assemblies to teach our children to show Respect and follow the Rule of Law through our Fundamental British Values and Personal, Social, Health and Emotional Curriculum. PLEASE PLEASE PLEASE can I urge parents to be compliant with the law and show respect towards our residents within the Avenue and surrounding roads. Fundamentally, you as parents, are the primary teachers for your children to be their positive role model and instil and influence positive values and morals through your actions and conduct.

We have had far too many 'near misses' and illegally parking could lead to disastrous outcomes. Please think and park legally....thank you.

# Is it illegal to park on zig-zag lines outside schools?

**Yes**, it's always illegal to park on yellow zig-zag lines anywhere. Rule 243 of the Highway Code indicates a range of places where motorists must not park, including on a bend, a dropped kerb or the brow of a hill. It also states that drivers must not **park near a school entrance**, anywhere that would prevent access for emergency services or near a bus stop, tram stop or taxi rank. Again, the rule will often — but not always — be made obvious with yellow zig-zags on the road.

Parking outside a school specifically may obstruct visibility for parents and children trying to cross the road and is thus highly dangerous.



Hopefully the above will have a positive impact informing parents to think about our residents and more importantly the safety of our precious children.

## School Uniform

- white or grey socks
- sensible black shoes not trainers or trainer style
