#### Key Notices and Reminders:

Gold Star Badges: Please search at home for any Gold Stars your child might have so they can be passed on to the next child in their class.

Please can parents ensure they stand in a line so that staff can dismiss safely and systematically.

#### <u>Lunchboxes</u>

Please can we remind you that we are a healthy school and that lunchboxes should contain a range of foods such as a sandwich, yoghurt, crisps, fruit and a small treat. Also, the amount you place in your lunchbox is the expectation of what your child will eat. Please NO Popcorn for children in Reception Class. Can I also remind you that grapes and strawberries must be cut lengthways and then into quarters to reduce choking. Thank you.

#### Parents Evening

A link will be sent in due course to book your Parents' Evening slot with your child's teacher.

#### **Celebrations**

Many families like to celebrate their child's birthday and other special events by bringing in cakes or sweets to the setting to share. This can mean that some children are eating unhealthy foods several times a week. As per the guidance from the Department of Education we will continue to implement that if you wish to mark a birthday or special event 'to ensure any food brought in from home is balanced' and meets the Birches' food guidelines, therefore, we will continue to recommend **fruit platters only** (no milkshakes) to share or non-edible options to celebrate with such as bubbles or stickers. Any food shared in the setting should be checked for potential allergens with the office. Parents should ensure that they have prepared the fruit in a hygienic way and that the fruit is cut ensuring it is not a choking hazard (lengthways and quartered). Staff will not prepare the fruit; it must be brought to school readily prepared.

#### Weather/Coats

We are now approaching the colder weather and rain unfortunately! Please ensure your child comes to school with a coat that is labelled-please practise fastening your coat with your child so they can become independent, especially in Nursery and Reception.

#### Games/PE

If your child is not participating in Games or PE they must come to school in their School Uniform not their Games Kit. Thank you.

#### <u>Juniper</u>

All correspondence will be there.
