<p>Country: a place with its own government, <u>occupying</u> a particular territory.</p> <p>Italy: a country in southern Europe</p> <p>Europe: a continent that is between Asia and the Atlantic Ocean and is north of the Mediterranean Sea.</p> <p>Rome: the capital city of Italy.</p> <p>Continent: a large solid area of land. The country is located on a peninsula in the Mediterranean Sea. Italy is a boot-shaped peninsula that juts out of southern Europe into the Adriatic Sea, Tyrrhenian Sea, Mediterranean Sea, and other waters.</p> <p>The capital city of Italy is Rome and some famous cities are Milan, Venice, Naples and Florence. Italy has 20 regions. The main native language is Italian.</p> <p>Italy borders six countries: France, Austria, Switzerland, Slovenia, Vatican City and San Marino. A flight to Italy's capital city Rome takes roughly 2 hours.</p>
