Some tasks may have a specific outcome whilst others may be more open ended, allowing your child to decide on the final outcome. For example, you could see who does the most chores or watches the TV the most.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">English</p> <p>Imagine you are explorers, currently on an adventure in Europe. You may want to be in a jungle, on top of some mountains or near a volcano – it's up to you!</p> <p>Write either a diary entry or a letter, explaining some of the things you have done or are going to do on your adventure. (Be as imaginative and crazy as you like).</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">History</p> <p>In the year AD 79, the volcano 'Mount Vesuvius' erupted, destroying the city of Pompeii. Research why people may have wanted to live right underneath a volcano and then decide whether you would take the risk and live near a volcano. Explain your reason.</p>
	<p style="text-align: center;">Geography</p> <p>Europe is a big continent made up of lots of different countries. Can you make a European map and put on some of the key features you might find in the different countries? For example, in France you could draw the Eiffel Tower.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Art</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Lots of famous artists have come from Europe. Can you produce a small fact file on a chosen artist? 2. Find a piece of artwork made by a European artist and try to recreate it yourself. <p>Possible Artists: Monet, Seurat, Michelangelo, Van Gogh</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Design</p> <p>Europe is famous for having some of the world's greatest chefs and bakers. With a responsible adult, can you try and create your own plate of food? You may want to research a recipe to find something that you want to make.</p> <p>Challenge: Try and make a 'healthy' dish that uses different fruits or vegetables.</p>
	<p style="text-align: center;">PSHE</p> <p>Think about what you might want to be when you are older. What might you need to do to help you achieve that goal? Create a mind map to show the different things you might need to do.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Science</p> <p>There are many different volcanoes and rainforests that you can find in Europe. Can you make a forest or volcano using different materials? You may want to make a cardboard jungle or papier mache volcano.</p> <p>Tip: mix bicarbonate of soda with vinegar to make your volcano 'erupt'.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Health & Wellbeing</p> <p>Create a collage of all the things you like and enjoy. You may want to use pictures from magazines, newspapers or images off the internet. You could also draw your own images to include.</p>
