



Consonants and Vowels

Vowels are the letters: **a**, **e**, **i**, **o**, **u** and sometimes **y**.

a e i o u

Consonants are all the other letters, such as: **b**, **d**, **t**, **s**, etc.

a b c d e f g h i j k l m n o p q r s t u v w x y z

What Do We Do?

Look at and read the word.

Listen to the vowel sound.

Ask: 'Is it long or short?'

Short Vowel Sounds

lap lapping lapping

beg begging begging

hit hitting hitting

nod nodding nodding

put putting putting

Rule

If the vowel is a short sound with only one consonant after it, then double the consonant in the spelling.



How Many Consonants Are after the Short Vowel?

back backing backing

stick sticking sticking

stand standing standing

hunt hu**nti**ng hunting

bank ba**nk**ing banking

turn turning turning

jump ju**mping** jumping

lift lifting lifting

Rule

If the vowel is a short sound but has more than one consonant after it, then add '-ing'.

tune tuning

Rule

If it ends in 'e', drop the 'e' when adding '-ing'.

Use this song to help you remember: 'Take off the e, add i-n-g.'

Rules for Adding '-ing'

Short vowel sound, with one consonant – double the consonant and add '-ing'

hitting

Short vowel sound, with two consonants – add '-ing'

jumping

Ending in 'e' – drop the 'e' then add '-ing'

joking

Long vowel sound – just add '-ing'

sailing
