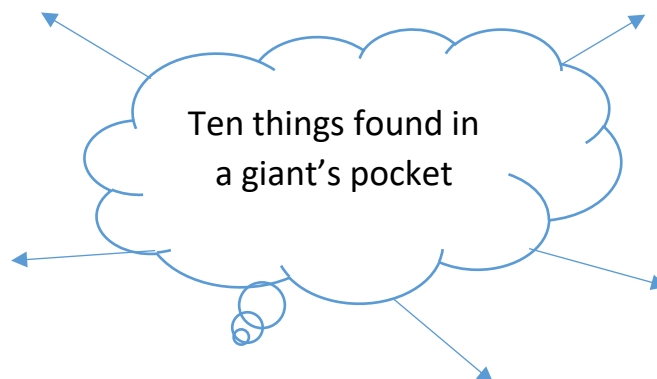
## Ten Things Found in a Wizard's Pocket

10. A snoring rabbit.

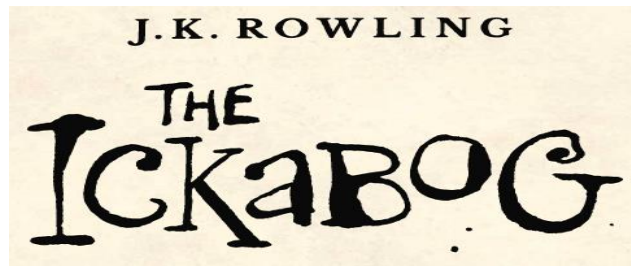
