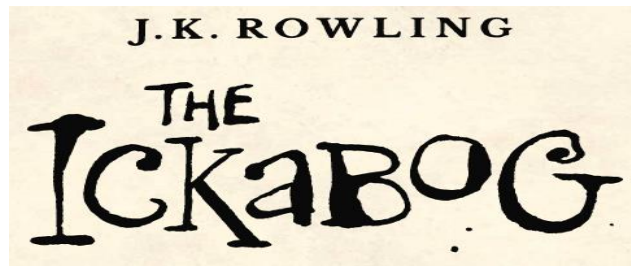
When listening to the story make some notes on who the characters are and the events that happen. These notes will be useful in your task tomorrow.
